

100 YEARS AND COUNTING

As we approach our 100th Anniversary the question arises how well do you know your Auxiliary? An important part of a community is its hospital. Likewise an important extension of a hospital is its Auxiliary made up of community members working to support their hospital.

To this end in 1916 the Women's Auxiliary of Overlook Hospital was created by 16 community minded ladies. During two World Wars, as the Auxiliary grew these ladies held fund raisers, folded bandages, redecorated hospital rooms and sewed linens. The ladies of the Auxiliary were responsible for <u>all</u> the linens in use in the hospital – Mondays were known as "sewing days."

Major changes to the Auxiliary began under Eloise Walker (1947-1949) with the addition of a Tea Room and Gift Shop. Many of our present Auxiliary members volunteered in the much loved and hugely successful Tea Room. During Gladys Travis's presidency (1949-1952) the Follies were initiated and Jean Hudson founded the Twigs thereby increasing membership in the Auxiliary tenfold.

With help from the Summit Playhouse Group and the Chatham Players the first Follies in 1949 had a cast of 185; it was such a success that the next in 1950 had a cast of 220 people. In three years, 1949-1951 the Follies raised \$38,000 for the hospital. Then followed a series of musicals, Show Boat, Carousel, Hello Dolly and in 1969 How to Succeed in Business.

In 1976 the Auxiliary celebrated the Overlook Hospital Diamond Jubilee with a generous donation towards the opening of the Center for Community Health. Overlook Hospital's guests for this grand event were Princess Grace of Monaco as the Honorary Chairman and Bob Hope adding his blend of warmth and funny stories.

In 1996 at the celebration of 80 years of service, the watch words were *Commitment, Challenge, Compassion, & Camaraderie:* commitment to our hospital, challenge to use our talents constructively, compassion for the ill or injured and camaraderie with people who work with you to lend a hand. Those goals remain the same today as in 1996.

Past endeavors from the Auxiliary include baby photo services, patient television services and a traveling gift cart with magazines and small patient craft projects. *Cooking is our Bag* was the very popular Auxiliary cookbook. It was a compilation of over 500 recipes from Auxiliary members, Overlook staff, celebrities and local restaurants.

Between 1982 & 1990 the Auxiliary raised over two million dollars. In 1990 the Auxiliary pledged \$500,000 to help finance the Child Care Center for employees. Other major fundraising endeavors during this time include the Center for Community Health, renovation of the main floor, a CAT scanner, six kidney dialysis units and two mobile intensive care vehicles to name just a few.

In the recent past, some of the funding from the Auxiliary includes: the Care Givers Center, the Emergency Department, the Neuro-Science Department, the Pediatric Playroom and Health Start. A significant amount of Auxiliary monetary contributions to the hospital are the result of fund raising activity by the Twigs. In 2008 the Auxiliary co-sponsored the Twin Maples Centennial Show House. Special events such as the biennial Kitchen Tour and the Overlook Hustle add some fun to Auxiliary and Twig fund raising activities.

In 1992 in response to a need for organ donors the Donate Life Committee was initiated. It was part of the Auxiliary until 2012 at which time the Twig disbanded and members became part of NJ Sharing Network.

This is just a sneak peek at some of the past activities of the Overlook Auxiliary. There is much more to be said. The Auxiliary strives to live up to its goal of commitment, challenge, compassion and camaraderie so eloquently expressed by Kassandra Romas on the occasion of 80 years of service by the Auxiliary. When all is said and done it is you, our members who make the Auxiliary a viable organization. Looking back and seeing what we have accomplished in our first one hundred years has been an amazing journey. Starting with sixteen ladies the Overlook Hospital Auxiliary has a lot to be proud of. As we move into our second century and a rapidly changing healthcare scene the Auxiliary will be needed more than ever.

We continue our support of the Music Program and the Palliative Care Chaplin among other Wish List items.

Moving forward is our Kitchen Tour in October, 2015 and our 100th Anniversary celebration, details which we will keep you informed of as it takes shape.

Diane and I want to wish each and every one of you a wonderful summer, take time to relax and smell the flowers as they say. We look forward to welcoming you all to another busy year beginning in September. We would also like to ask you to remember the Gift Shop & Bloom when shopping for that special someone or gift. The Gift Shop & Bloom is the main source of revenue for the Auxiliary, without which we could not accomplish as much for Overlook as we do.
